## CALLING FOR SUBMISSIONS!

The Rehabilitation Services Administration is redesigning the National Clearinghouse on Rehabilitation Training Materials (NCRTM). The redesign will make it easier for the vocational rehabilitation and education communities, grantees, researchers, trainers and practitioners to disseminate, find and use valuable training materials, quickly and efficiently.

### WHAT'S NEW?

- A focus on materials useful for training purposes.
- User-friendly way to submit materials and identify preferred search terms.
- Robust search functionalities and filters that allow users to sort and find relevant resources quickly.
- A star rating system for users to rate the quality and usefulness of resources.
- Upgrades for usability, mobile access and accessibility.

### WHAT TO SUBMIT?

The NCRTM is a searchable repository of materials useful for pre-service or in-service training related to rehabilitation training--especially those developed through RSA funding including:

- Curricula
- Self-directed online training
- Web-based training
- Peer-to-peer training
- Instructional videos

### WHY SUBMIT?

- Disseminate training products to targeted audiences.
- Solicit feedback through an optional peer review process.
- Receive recognition for top-rated materials.
- Gain visibility and contribute to the field.

### WHAT'S NEXT?

- In Mid-November, RSA will launch a temporary submission portal for those who wish to offer materials before the official 2015 opening.
- Submissions that are uploaded early will undergo a review and indexing process to ensure materials are categorized properly for the 2015 opening.
